JOHN GREATHOUSE, SEN. [NO WIFE] to GEORGE WALKER

84 Acres on Jessamine Creek for \$1,136.00

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This Indenture made the eighth day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and Eleven between John Greathouse Sen. of the State of Kentucky and County of Jessamine of the one part and George Walker of the State of Kentucky aforesaid of the other part doth testify that the said John for an consideration of the sum of One thousand and thirty six Dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge (and forever acquit & discharge) the said George Walker his heirs George and Ann both granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and both by these presents grant bargain sell alien confirm unto the said George Walker his heirs and assigns forever all that Tract of ~~land~~ or parcel of land situated lying and being in the County of Jessamine on the waters of Jessamine Creek and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at two white oak Hackberry William Caldwell M. G. Cooper Solomon
